

****Always****: You will use this adverb to describe something that happens all the time. For example, 'I always brush my teeth before bed.'



****Usually****: Your task is to use this adverb to describe something that happens most of the time. For example, 'She usually walks to school.'



****Often****: You will use this adverb to describe something that happens frequently. For example, 'We often go to the park on weekends.'



****Sometimes****: Your task is to use this adverb to describe something that happens occasionally. For example, 'He sometimes forgets his homework.'



****Rarely****: You will use this adverb to describe something that happens infrequently. For example, 'They rarely eat out at restaurants.'



****Never****: Your task is to use this adverb to describe something that does not happen at all. For example, 'I never drink soda.'



****Always****: You will use this adverb to describe something that happens all the time. For example, 'She always reads before bed.'



****Usually****: Your task is to use this adverb to describe something that happens most of the time. For example, 'He usually finishes his homework on time.'



****Often****: You will use this adverb to describe something that happens frequently. For example, 'They often visit their grandparents.'



****Sometimes****: Your task is to use this adverb to describe something that happens occasionally. For example, 'I sometimes play video games after school.'
